Aiming High for Disabled Children (AHDC) is a national initiative to improve services for children with disabilities and their families.

As part of this initiative, Wandsworth Council and NHS Wandsworth are able to provide funding for;

- up to £500 of extra support for families with children and young people with a substantial and permanent disability to go on holiday or days out together.
- small grants of up to £4,999, for private, voluntary, independent or maintained groups. This is to enable disabled children and young people to join in with the same play, sporting, leisure and social activities as others of their own age or interests.
